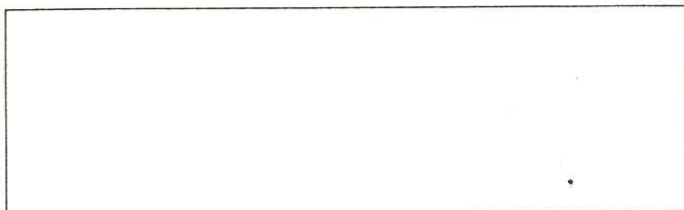

I hereby terminate my membership of your MRA. I do not wish to be associated with any group that supports the Australian Motorcycle council.

The AMC was set up to fight restrictive legislation at a federal level. While the government was passing a lights-on ADR which will clearly lead to legislation the AMC was busy taking legal action against its own kind against a democratic vote.

The AMC is not democratic and is a negative influence on motorcycling.

After the lights-on fight I want nothing to do with any member of the AMC. The AMC, as I understand it, now consists of MRAs WA, SA & ACT with FAM NSW, Bikers Ltd and the ACU NSW. How they can justify a sports body that is part of the same Council that brought us the ISDE and GP fiascos I cant imagine. The AMC is certainly not representative of the motorcycle community nationally - but, in truth, I dont think it ever intended to be.
